Activity consent form HPE Swimming and Water Safety - Year 4

In Term 4, Year 4 students will be participating in water safety swimming lessons as part of our HPE program. Lessons will commence in the week beginning September 30th (Term 4, Week 1) and will continue until week 9. The aim of the program is to complete an appropriate level of Royal Lifesaving's Swim & Survive program in a safe, positive, and engaging environment.

Activity details: Students will be assessed at the beginning of the term and placed in small groups based on their current swimming ability. Georgie Parkes Swim School provide instructors to support the HPE teachers, providing an extra 2 instructors per class.

Lesson times will be advised by classroom teachers at the beginning of the term. All students must bring the following items to every class in order to participate in swimming lessons:

- Swimmers
- Swimming shirt or rashie
- Swimming cap
- Goggles are an optional accessory for comfort, but are not compulsory for participation

Activity costs: There is no cost to this activity.
